



Jackie's Kitchen

Recently I've been asked quite a few times for recipes for liver cake etc. It might be because I've been taking some obedience classes and the dogs are mugging me for my treats rather than 'commercial treats' in a packet! Anyway, here are a few basic recipes, I KNOW there are many variations....

Liver Cake

2 packs of pre-packed liver
4 eggs

Good squirt of garlic puree

About 6 -8 good dessertspoons of plain flour

Blitz the liver in a blender, add the eggs and garlic puree, blitz again, transfer to another bowl and stir in the flour until I would say a thick batter consistency.

Place in a lined shallow roasting tin and bake on a low/moderate heat (depends on your oven!) for about 25 minutes. I then turn the oven off and let the cake dry out and cool in the oven.

When cool chop into small pieces. Can be frozen.



Tuna Cake

As above but use 2 large tins of tuna IN OIL with the 4 eggs.
You should end up with about 6 bags containing 6oz of treats.

Pilchard Cake

Thanks Judith Trickett for this variation, my dogs love it!

2 large tins of Pilchards in tomato sauce.

4 eggs WITH SHELLS!

My usual squirt of garlic puree.

Some chopped/grated carrot

Method is the same



Dogs work best for HIGH VALUE treats, this is to say, they have to learn to earn and WANT to do this for the fantastic reward that they will get. (I do know that some dogs are not food motivated and work better for a toy. In which case, make the toy very special and it only comes out for training!)

With food treats, they are also only used for training.

Don't just stick to one recipe of treat for too long though as the value will diminish. Vary what you use every so often.
